If there is not a pencil case built into the binder, adding a case that clips into the binder would be a good idea.

### **New Student Policy Changes 2018-2019**

The office phone is primarily for office use. **Student usage will be discouraged in all but extreme cases.** Personal messages will not be delivered to students during class time. **Cell phones are not permitted to be used by students during instructional hours, unless permission is given by the teacher.** Violation of this policy may result in seizure of the device. **Hair covers, including hats, bandanas and sweatshirt hoods(worn over the head), blankets, pajamas, slippers or wraps** will not be worn upon entering the building. Hats must be kept in lockers and are not allowed to be carried around. **Coats, backpacks, and jackets** are to be kept in lockers and not worn to class(unless directed to do so by staff).

### **Annual Legal Notifications**

**PARENTAL/COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT:** Parents and community members are a vital part of the students educational experience. There are many ways that parents and community members can be involved in our school district. Parent teacher conferences are scheduled during the school year along with different activities within the classroom. Parents and community members are encouraged to serve on the School Improvement Team, the Native American Parent committee, the Booster Club, or one of the organized Parent Volunteer Groups. Contact Robert Vaught if you are interested in any of these committees.

**INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIAL:** Members of the public have the right to inspect instructional materials, including but not limited to print and non-print materials, teacher's manuals, films, tapes and any other supplementary materials used as part of the educational curriculum. An appointment must be made by calling Robert Vaught.

**PESTICIDE APPLICATIONS:** Parents have the right to be informed of any pesticide applications made on school property. If you would like to have prior notification of pesticide applications, you may fill out a form in the central office. Prior notification of non-emergency applications will be posted on the entrance of the school building.

**DIRECTORY INFORMATION:** The District shall release student directory information to United States Armed Forces Recruiting offices upon request. Parents have the right to remove their children's information from this list by submitting a written request to district office.

**DRUG-FREE SCHOOL ZONE:** The "Drug-Free School Zone" extends 1000 feet from the boundary of any school property. The Board prohibits the use, possession, sale, concealment, delivery, or distribution of any drug or any drug-related paraphernalia at any time on District property, within the Drug-Free School Zone, or at any District-related event.

**BLOOD-BORNE PATHOGENS:** Each year, staff members are trained in proper handling of Blood-Borne Pathogens. If students are accidentally exposed, parents/guardians will be notified.

**BULLY/CYBERBULLY:** It is the policy of the District to provide a safe and nurturing educational environment for all of its students. This policy protects all students from bullying/aggressive behavior regardless of the subject matter or motivation for such impermissible behavior. See policy #5517.01 for more details.

**COURSE OFFERINGS:** Any student grades 6—12 may choose to take an on-line course through an approved provider. Any student in grades 8—12 that is eligible to take Dual-Enrollment courses may sign up to take such course. Please see Mr. Vaught for both on-line course registration as well as Dual-enrollment registration.

**COMPLIANCE OFFICER:** Any Civil Rights Complaints, Due Process Complaints or Harassment Complaints can be filed with the District Compliance Officer. The designated Compliance Officer is Robert Vaught, Superintendent, 202 S Division St., PO Box 429, DeTour Village, MI 49725. Complaints must be made in writing and either received in person or by US Postal Service.

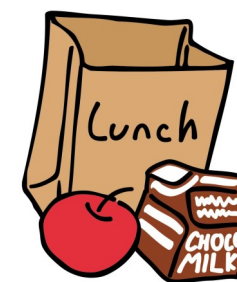

### STUDENT MEDICATION

Any medication your child needs to take at school, must be turned into the office in the original prescription bottle with dosage indicated. Pain medication such as Tylenol, Advil, Aleve, etc. must also be stored in the office. Parents can send a bottle into the office with the students name on it and the recommended dosage. The school does not keep this type of medication on hand and students are not supposed to keep any pills in their lockers.
